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1. Velo-city: The annual world cycling summit

The Velo-city conference is the annual flagship event of the European Cyclists' Federation (ECF). Since the Velo-city conference series took off in 1980 in Bremen, Germany, it has established itself as the annual world cycling summit, attracting thousands of high-level participants each year.

Like no other event, Velo-city offers a knowledge exchange and policy transfer platform where advocates, cities, decisionmakers, academics and industry leaders meet to shape the future of cycling.

Each conference lasts four days with a programme of 6-7 plenary sessions and more than 55 parallel sessions. Velo-city also offers an exhibition, technical visits, social events and a bike parade. Velo-city conferences attract a growing number of 1,400 delegates, the so-called Velo-citizens.

Taking place on **14-17 June 2022 under the theme Cycling the Change, Velo-city 2022 Ljubljana** will be jointly hosted by the European Cyclists' Federation (ECF), Gospodarsko

Velo-city 2022 Ljubljana Cycling the Change

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Meet the host city: Ljubljana, the hidden gem of Europe

The City of Ljubljana is one of the most successful recent examples of a city that decided to push sustainable mobility by closing its city centre to cars and prioritise pedestrians and cyclists over individual motorised traffic. As a result, the ambitious cycling city has received multiple awards in recognition of its sustainable urban development policies, including European Green Capital 2016, European Mobility Week 2003 and 2013, Prize for Urban Public Space 2012, Access City Award 2015 and 2018, European Best Green Capital in 2021 and Best European Destination 2022.

Over the past decade, the City of Ljubljana has implemented many measures for more cycling: **Revamping public space**: In 2015, under the flag of reclaiming public space for people, the City of Ljubljana closed Slovenska cesta, one of its main traffic arteries connecting the city from north to south, to motorised traffic. Slovenska cesta, a street that until 2013 did not even have a bike lane, is now a shared space for pedestrians, cyclists and public transport users.

Infrastructure: Ljubljana has a cycle network of more than 300 km of cycle lanes, which continues to grow every year. In 2021, the Slovenian capital built several 10 kilometres of

cycle lanes. Ljubljana also boasts 17 ha of pedestrian zone where cycling is allowed and motorised traffic restricted.

Cycling is also allowed in opposite direction in more than 120 one-way streets. Ljubljana also has three bike parks for mountain biking and BMX bikes.

Safe parking: In 2021 and 2022, the City of Ljubljana installed around 300 new bike racks to sustain the rapid increase in the number of cyclists. This year, the city plans to establish an underground bicycle garage for over 100 bicycles.

Bike sharing: Ljubljana's bike-sharing scheme, Bicikelj, is one of the most successful schemes in the EU. Each bike is rented out

eight times per day on average. With more than 80 stations and 800 bicycles, 17% of Ljubljana's residents use it regularly. In 2022 Ljubljana will establish an e-bike sharing system. **Promotion**: The City of Ljubljana regularly informs the public about the latest cycling development through campaigns and events such as the European Mobility Week.



Technical visits

During the Velo-city conference every day delegates will have the possibility to discover Ljubljana's cycling developments by taking part in technical visits led by experts in small groups on a bike.

Discover the 5 tours here below:

TOUR 1: THEMATIC CYCLING ROUTES TOUR – 120min TOGETHER ON A 11-KILOMETRE-LONG MIX OF THEMATIC WAYS

The aim of the thematic cycling paths is to establish attractive cycling links between various parts of Ljubljana along less busy streets for daily commutes by bicycle. Since 2014, we have marked four thematic cycling paths: Waterside path (12km), Plečnik's path (14km), Forest path (7km), and the path around Ljubljana along the Path of Remembrance and Comradeship (32km). In this tour we are going to see the mix of all 4 of them.

TOUR 2:

THE OLD CITY TOUR – 60min

HOW HAVE WE TURNED OUR CITY CENTRE, CONGESTED WITH MOTOR VEHICLE TRAFFIC, INTO A PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLING FRIENDLY PUBLIC SPACE?

We gradually completely renovated the city centre and redesigned it into a pedestrian area with a size of more than 13 ha. One of the most visible measures for introducing a high-quality public space in the city centre is the rearrangement of a part of the main traffic axis - Slovenska cesta - into an area dedicated to pedestrians, cyclists and city bus users (shared space). By building or renovating 13 bridges over the Ljubljanica, we linked the embankments and shortened the distances.

TOUR 3:

"WATERSIDE CYCLING TOUR" TOUR – 120min TOGETHER ON A WATERSIDE CYCLING ROUTE

With its numerous interesting bridges and picturesque embankments, the river Ljubljanica gives the old centre of Ljubljana an unmistakable air. The river served as the city's principal commercial artery and supply route from Roman times until the arrival of the railway in the mid-nineteenth century. The architect Jože Plečnik left a decisive mark on the city with his arrangement of the river embankments in the old town centre, designing tree-lined promenades and creating or renovating a series of bridges over the river and its tributaries. The Ljubljanica embankments are today a lively gathering place with numerous outdoor cafés. The Waterside Cycling Route links the urban environment with some of the less well known areas of Ljubljana and the surrounding countryside. The entire route runs along the banks of the Ljubljanica, the river that gives the city its special charm.

TOUR 4: CYCLING AS PART OF INTERMODALITY TOUR – 90min HOW ARE WE REDUCING THE NUMBER OF CARS IN THE CITY CENTRE WITH THE P+R SYSTEM?

The P+R system (P+R stands for park and ride) is a combination of private and public transportation, which allows users to reach the main points on the city outskirts or the radial roads with their cars and continue their journey to the city by bus or a bicycle from the BicikeLJ bike-sharing system. The bicycle is accessible by a 7-day ticket or an annual subscription. By paying a parking fee of 1.30 euros, the P+R system users are entitled to two bus rides on the same day. This way, the number of cars in the city centre is reduced. In Ljubljana, there are six P+R facilities that operate within the P+R system.

TOUR 5:

LEISURE CYCLING TOUR - 60min

HOW ARE WE TRANSFORMING BROWNFIELD SITES INTO PUMP TRACKS OR GREEN SURFACES?

Since the bicycle parks caused such widespread thrill, we have decided to keep turning some degraded areas into pump tracks. At the intersection of the streets Linhartova and Topniška cesta, we have arranged the new bicycle park KoloPark Bežigrad within the European Mobility week 2017. Like KoloPark Šiška it also offers free-of-charge fun and practice with all kinds of self-propelled vehicles, from bikes, kick scooters, skateboards, inline skates, to roller skates and foot-propelled bikes.

VELO-CITY 2022 BIKE PARADE

The Bike Parade is a highlight for many conference participants. It is a giant bike tour through the main streets of the city, open to all citizens. Bicycles will be provided to all registered Velocity delegates at GR just beforehand. To end the parade in a relaxed and festive atmosphere everyone is invited to join the cycling festival afterwards with drinks and food trucks (at own cost), concerts, an open-air party and other surprises at the Congress Square.


